12. Practical applicability:

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The results will facilitate the use of a range of ethnic minorities' languages in general and Tay ethnic minority language in particular with an aim of providing long-term benefits for the nation.

Introducing a novel source for the study of ethnic minority languages as well as raising awareness of the society towards the value of ethnic minority languages in the context of sustainable development for the region. Furthermore, the study advocates policy makers in further strengthening the future policy in response to the problem of the endangerment of ethnic minority languages.

## 13. Further research directions:

The direction of this research may stretch its steps to other areas with the ultimate goal of centralizing on language situation of a specific area as a major orientation of study. Indeed, there are many other areas with regionally dominant languages such as North - West with Thai, South Central Coast - Cham, Ede - Highlands, the Mekong river Delta - Khmer
