11. Summary of the new findings of the thesis:

The thesis has acquired and further clarified theoretical issues on bankruptcy and business bankruptcy under Vietnam Bankruptcy Law, with reference to other countries’ laws to draw a lesson for Vietnam in finalization of bankruptcy law.

The thesis analyzed and recognized some provisions as advanced and appropriate to be acquired and developed in the finalization of bankruptcy law, at the same time pointed out shortcoming and limitation in Bankruptcy Law 2004.

The thesis analyzed and evaluated institutions executing bankruptcy law, especially pointed out weakness, limitation of judiciary in assuming jurisdiction, implementing business bankruptcy procedures, in association with provisions of procedure law.

Besides, the research gave some results that were hardly mentioned in previous thesis or researches, while these results have high value of reference in execution of the new bankruptcy law which has been recently passed by National Assembly.

The thesis has initially proposed some basic orientations and solutions to enhance feasibility of Bankruptcy Law including solutions on policies, solutions on executing body of bankruptcy law, solutions to finalize Bankruptcy law by acquiring advantages and overcoming shortcomings in Bankruptcy Law 2004.

Teaching and academic study of universities, research institutes.

Execution of bankruptcy law for organizations in concern such as courts, executing agencies, etc.

Finalization of bankruptcy law of policy planning agencies.

13. Further research directions:

Continue to finalize Vietnam Bankruptcy Law in the next stage, in conformity with economic, political and social conditions of Vietnam as well as international law.

Enhance the feasibility of bankruptcy law through strengthening executing institutions.
